

### **Honorary Federal Life Membership Citation: David Hine**

David Hine joined the Junior School Heads Association of Australia (JSHAA/IPSHA) in 1986, when he was appointed to the position of Head of Junior School at St Michael's College, South Australia. Over the course of the next 33 years he has held similar positions in NSW, QLD and WA, leading by example and with the highly effective "Hine" style.

His contribution to the education of students in each of these environments has been outstanding as has his active involvement in four separate State Branches. His ongoing friendship with many members across Australia is a testament to his pro-active, collegial and supportive approach.

Federal Life Membership is the Association's highest honour and David more than meets the criteria. He was a Federal Board member for 18 years: 16 of which he served as part of the Federal Executive. Between 1992-2010, he held every possible position on the Federal Board:

\*In addition, David has also been the SA Branch Secretary (1990-1992) and the SA Branch Treasurer (2011-2018).

As a member at both Branch and Federal level David has demonstrated commitment to the members, the development of the organisation and championed IPSHA's core values. He has enthusiastically attended Biennial Conferences, Tri-State Seminars and Weekend Retreats as a Branch Member and as a member of the Federal Executive. This has included being a member of the conference organising committees in Adelaide in 1994 and the Gold Coast in 2006, as well as financial oversight of Biennial Conferences as the Federal Treasurer. In addition, David compiled the first Members' Directory, created the IPSHA History Database, edited the Federal eLink, and maintained the Memorandum and Articles of the Association and the Principles of Practices. He was also a member of the Federal Executive who initiated the renaming of JSHAA to IPSHA and instituted our biennial Federal Fundraiser.

However, these numerous and worthy activities superficially describe David's contribution to IPSHA. It is undoubtedly his inimitable approach that has endeared him to countless members and made him a valuable confidant, colleague and friend. His love of wine, great food and fun have been the perfect vehicle for his profound impact both nationally and internationally.

At the conclusion of his final stint on the Federal Executive, Keith Dalleywater congratulated David for his extensive service and pronounced that David Hine is IPSHA. This encapsulates perfectly David and his unparalleled contribution. The South Australian Branch unreservedly believe that David is most deserving of Honorary Federal Life Membership.
